CA Blue-Eyed Grass

Sisyrinchium bellum

- Wildflower—"grass-iris"
- Flower: blue-purple flower at the end of stem, Mar-May
- Tufted, many stemmed, 4-12 in. tall
- Narrow, grass-like dark green foliage, slightly shorter than flower

+ Native

Woolly Blue Curls

Trichostema lanceolatum

- Wildflower: bush grows from single woody stem, many branched
- Leaves: yellow-green, small, slim, thickly set along stem
- Flower: woolly, blue, curly, many distinct flowers lined up at end of branch

- Non-Native

Field Bindweed

Convolvulus arvensis

- Flower: funnel-shaped, pale yellow center, white to pink petals
- Leaves: green, arrow-headed
- Vine wraps around itself and other plants
- Perennial with extensive root system, deep taproot

- Non-Native

Bull Thistle

Cirsium vulgare

- Weed with spiky green leaves with white markings, many branches
- Flower: pinkish purple, shaped like a "ball" that becomes a "cotton" puff
- Extremely invasive
- Does serve as food source for goldfinches
