

New Core Information for Old Core Students: Business School

Santa Clara's new Core curriculum will be implemented in Fall 2009. How will students under the old Core curriculum be affected by the new Core?

- *Old Core students will continue to follow the Core requirements outlined in the Undergraduate Bulletin published in their entering year.*
- *Transfer students entering in Fall 2009 will follow the old Core. Transfer students entering in Fall 2010 or after will normally follow the new Core.*
- *Courses fulfilling old Core requirements will be available as needed. Old Core students may take appropriate new Core courses to fulfill old Core requirements. See the Table below.*
