She also is a member of the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB). Professor Barth is a recipient of the Stanford GSB's MBA Distinguished Teaching and PhD Faculty Distinguished Service Awards. Prior to joining the IASB, Professor Barth's accounting standard setting activities included serving as a member of the Accounting Standards Executive Committee of the American Institute of CPAs and the Financial Accounting Standards Advisory Council of the Financial Accounting Standards Board. Prior to joining the faculty at Stanford in 1995, she was an audit partner in Arthur Andersen & Co. Professor Barth holds an AB from Cornell University, an MBA from Boston University, and a PhD from Stanford University.
