Most students will take *Foundations* courses in the first year. Otherwise, Core course sequences, in most cases, are flexible. Exceptions:

- CTW 1 and 2 and C&I 1 and 2 must be taken in sequence, with courses on the same theme
- C&I 1 and 2 are prerequisites for C&I 3
- CTW 1& 2 are prerequisites for Advanced Writing
- RTC courses must be taken in sequence and RTC 3 only satisfies the Core requirement after students have completed 88 quarter units
- Students normally take a Science, Technology, and Society course after completing Natural Science and Social Science courses.

Most Core courses are four or five unit courses. See the *Core Guide* (www.scu.edu/Core) for exceptions.
