## What is Ethics Camp Express?

This 2-day camp is for teachers, counselors, and administrators in alternative, continuation, special, correctional, and general education programs for at-risk students and juvenile offenders.

This session focuses on practices that build character with students who may be difficult to teach.

Participants learn modified interventions in literacy, life-skills, emotional management, and cognitive skills to improve coping and cooperation.

The comprehensive program includes daily written, oral, and visual language with linked instruction in coping, cooperation, and thinking skills.

### Character Based Literacy Program

**For those who have not attended a previous ethics camp**, we have planned sessions that will analyze the CBL program themes, novels, and activities. We will develop the five themes in CBL, explore the reading list, use advanced CBL activities, navigate the Web site, and access the lesson plans.

### Assessment and Evidence in the CBL program

**For those who have attended a previous ethics camp**, we have planned a session focusing on assessment and evidence in the CBL program. This session will focus on assessment of reading, vocabulary, and comprehension for the individual novels, rubrics for the writing prompts, and performance assessment in the CBL units.
