SCU Delegation to Magis/World Youth Day 2011
Bannan Grant Proposal
Submitted by Jack Treacy, SJ

With the encouragement of Michael Engh, SJ, two Jesuits—Jack Treacy, SJ and Paul Mariani, SJ-- have formed a delegation of ten, including eight undergraduate students, to participate in Magis/World Youth Day 2011. It is a fifteen-day program which includes Ignatian spirituality, shared prayer and reflection, a service component, faith formation, and cultural offerings.

The ten-day Magis program will involve some 2,000 young adults from Jesuit institutions from around the world. We will gather for the first three days at Loyola, Spain, the birthplace of Ignatius of Loyola, for some preliminary reflection and grounding in Ignatian spirituality. This will also offer our students the opportunity to meet other Catholics from diverse cultures, to share their faith, and learn of other's stories and traditions.

We will then travel in small groups of 8-10 for various service opportunities throughout Spain and Portugal. Opportunities will include social services for those most in need, ecological projects, pilgrimages, faith and culture groups, and spirituality groups. The Jesuits will serve as animators (or facilitators) for the small groups. Participants will pray the Examen and share a liturgy each day. Thus, we will weave together prayer, service and reflection.

The Magis group will re-convene in Madrid, Spain, for the final day. This will offer us an opportunity to share with others something our experiences, and to deepen those relationships which were started at Loyola.

The Magis group will then join with hundreds of thousands of others for the five-day World Youth Day, which will take place in Madrid from Aug. 16-21. These days will be spent in faith formation, catechesis, worship, and cultural exchange. The gathering is capped with a prayer vigil one evening, and Mass on the final day with Pope Benedict XVI. The numbers at these latter events could well exceed one million.

We are investing our time and energy in this project because we believe it connects directly with the vision and mission of Santa Clara University, as well as the recently released University Strategic Plan.

Our expected outcomes include the following:

1) Students will deepen their Catholic identity. A number of students in their application essays described their desire to do just that.

2) Students will gain insight into Ignatian spirituality. The Magis program, planned by the Jesuit Provinces of Spain and Portugal, is intended to ensure that participants gain knowledge and experience in our Ignatian spirituality.

3) Students will enlarge their minds and hearts about the reality of the wider world, and experience themselves in the context of a wider Catholic community through prayer, reflection and shared action.

2) Students will expand their knowledge of cultural contexts of faith communities. This program offers them a unique opportunity to come to know others of very diverse nations and cultures. In fact, former pilgrims have commented on World Youth Day being one of the most powerful experiences they have ever had of the universality of the Church.

We will have several gatherings during the Spring quarter to begin this process, and intend to have the group reconvene when we return to campus in the Fall. We are also anticipating a Jesuit joining Campus Ministry who has solid experience in forming Christian Life Communities. We expect that at least some of our student participants will be involved in assisting those groups to form and take root in our campus community.

Given that the Ignatian Center for Jesuit Education is dedicated to preserving and extending the Catholic identity and Jesuit mission of Santa Clara University, this project seems an appropriate use of Bannan funds.
