Bachelor of Arts Degree

Majors: Art, Art History, Classics (Ancient Studies, Classical Languages and Literature), Communication, English, History, Modern Languages (French, German, Italian, Spanish), Philosophy, Religious Studies, Performing Arts (Music, Theatre, Dance).

The minimum required courses for admission are:

- 1) **English:** English EWRT1A and EWRT 1B.
- 2) **Mathematics:** One course such as Math 1A, 1B, 10, or 11.
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science:** One lab science course such as Biology 6A, 6B, 6C, 10, 11, 13, 15, 40A, 40B, 40C; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 1C, 10, 12A, 12B, 12C, 30A, 30B; ESCI 19, 20, 21, 30; Geology 10, 11, 12; Meteorology 10/10L; Physics 2A, 2B, 2C, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

- 4) **Western Culture:** Three courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 2A, 2B, 2C; History 4A, 4B, 4C; Philosophy 20A, 20B, 20C.
- 5) **Math or Biological/Physical Science:** One additional course in either subject area. The science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: Astronomy 4; Biology 8, 45; Geology 11, 12; Physics 10.
- 6) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the third course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
- 7) **Social Sciences:** One course such as Anthropology 2, 4; Economics 1, 2; International 8; Political Science 1, 2, 3, 5; Psychology 1, 2, 5, 6, 8; Sociology 1, 5, 8, 20, 28, 35; Women's Studies 28.
- 8) **United States:** One course such as Art 2F, 3TD; English (ELIT) 6, 24, 48A, 48B, 48C; F/TV 48; History 9, 17A 17B, 17C, 18A, 18B; ICS 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 18A, 18B, 20, 22, 24, 31, 32, 35, 43, 44; Political Science 1; Women's Studies 8, 9.
- 9) **Ethnic/Women's Studies:** One course such as Anthropology 4, 6; Art 2E, 2F, 3TC, 2H; English Lit. 6, 21, 22, 24, 44; History 9, 18A, 18B; F/TV 48; Humanities 9; ICS 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 18A, 18B, 20, 22, 24, 30, 31, 32, 33, 35; International 20, 21; Psychology 12; Sociology 28, 35; Women's Studies 1, 3C, 6, 8, 9, 12, 21, 28.
- 10) **World Cultures/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area List or one each from the Area and Global Lists. **Area:** Anthropology 2; Art 2G, 2H; History 16A, 16B, 19A, 19B, 19C; Humanities 14A, 14B, 14C; ICS 16A, 16B; International 10, 11, 12, 19A, 19B, 19C, 21, 30; Philosophy 14A, 14B, 14C; Political Science 2. **Global:** Geography 10, International 50.
- 11) **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling four units, such as Art 4A, 4B, 4C, 8, 12, 14, 15A, 15B, 15C, 16A, 16B, 16C, 18A, 18B, 18C, 19G, 19H, 19I, 19J, 19K, 37A, 37B, 37C; Dance 22, 22K, 22L, 23A, 23B, 23H, 23L, 23M, 24A, 24B, 24C, 37A, 37B; Music 12A, 12B, 12C, 13A, 13B, 14A, 14B, 14C, 18; P.E. 22, 22K, 22L, 23A, 23B, 23H, 23L, 23M, 24A, 24B, 24C, 37A, 37B; Photography 1, 2, 3; Theatre Arts 20A, 20B, 20C.
- 12) **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.

Bachelor of Science Degree

Majors: Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Combined Sciences, Economics, Engineering, Physics, Environmental Studies, Liberal Studies, Mathematics and Computer Sciences, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology.

The minimum required courses for admission are:

- 1) **English:** EWRT1A and EWRT 1B.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Math 1A and 1B. Sociology/Anthropology/Political Science/Psychology majors can take Math 10 and 11.
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science :** One lab science course such as Biology 6A, 6B, 6C, 10, 11, 13, 15, 40A, 40B, 40C; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 1C, 10, 12A, 12B, 12C, 30A, 30B; ESCI 19, 20, 21, 30; Geology 10, 11, 12; Meteorology 10/10L; Physics 2A, 2B, 2C, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

- 4) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 2A, 2B, 2C; History 4A, 4B, 4C; Philosophy 20A, 20B, 20C.
- 5) **Biological or Physical Science:** One additional course in science. This second science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: Astronomy 4; Biology 8, 45, Geology 11, 12; Physics 10.
- 6) **Modern Languages: Bachelor of Science** students in the **Social Sciences** must successfully complete the **third course** of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination. **Bachelor of Science** students majoring in **Natural Sciences or Mathematics** must successfully complete the **second course** of the first-year college-level sequence classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
- 7) **Social Sciences:** One course such as Anthropology 2, 4; Economics 1, 2; International 8; Political Science 1, 2, 3, 5; Psychology 1, 2, 5, 6, 8; Sociology 1, 5, 8, 20, 28, 35; Women's Studies 28.
- 8) **United States:** One course such as Art 2F, 3TD; English (ELIT) 6, 24, 48A, 48B, 48C; F/TV 48; History 9, 17A 17B, 17C, 18A, 18B; ICS 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 18A, 18B, 20, 22, 24, 31, 32, 35, 43, 44; Political Science 1; Women's Studies 8, 9.
- 9) **Ethnic/Women's Studies:** One course such as Anthropology 4, 6; Art 2E, 2F, 3TC, 2H; English Lit. 6, 21, 22, 24, 44; History 9, 18A, 18B; F/TV 48; Humanities 9; ICS 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 18A, 18B, 20, 22, 24, 30, 31, 32, 33, 35; International 20, 21; Psychology 12; Sociology 28, 35; Women's Studies 1, 3C, 6, 8, 9, 12, 21, 28.
- 10) **World Cultures/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area List or one each from the Area and Global Lists. **Area:** Anthropology 2; Art 2G, 2H; History 16A, 16B, 19A, 19B, 19C; Humanities 14A, 14B, 14C; ICS 16A, 16B; International 10, 11, 12, 19A, 19B, 19C, 21, 30; Philosophy 14A, 14B, 14C; Political Science 2. **Global:** Geography 10, International 50.
- 11) **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling four units, such as Art 4A, 4B, 4C, 8, 12, 14, 15A, 15B, 15C, 16A, 16B, 16C, 18A, 18B, 18C, 19G, 19H, 19I, 19J, 19K, 37A, 37B, 37C; Dance 22, 22K, 22L, 23A, 23B, 23H, 23L, 23M, 24A, 24B, 24C, 37A, 37B; Music 12A, 12B, 12C, 13A, 13B, 14A, 14B, 14C, 18; P.E. 22, 22K, 22L, 23A, 23B, 23H, 23L, 23M, 24A, 24B, 24C, 37A, 37B; Photography 1, 2, 3; Theatre Arts 20A, 20B, 20C.

- 5) **Social Sciences:** Political Science 1, and Psychology 1.
- 6) **United States:** History 17A or 17B.
- 7) **World Cultures/Area:** Anthropology 2.
- 8) **World Cultures/Global:** Geography 10
- 8) **Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling four units, such as Dance 22, 22K, 22L, 23A, 23B, 23H, 23L, 23M, 24A, 24B, 24C, 37A, 37B; Music 12A, 12B, 12C, 13A, 13B, 14A, 14B, 14C, 18; P.E. 22, 22K, 22L, 23A, 23B, 23H, 23L, 23M, 24A, 24B, 24C, 37A, 37B; Theatre Arts 20A, 20B, 20C.
- 9) **Biological or Physical Science with a Lab, Ethnic/Women's Studies, Studio/Performing Arts, Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.
