Thank you for your interest in Santa Clara University! This guide has been designed to help make the course-planning process easier for students who wish to transfer into the College of Arts & Sciences at SCU.

Prospective transfer students please note the following prior to using this document:

- This guide represents the core (general education) curriculum Santa Clara University had in place for incoming freshmen students through Fall 2008. As of Fall 2009, SCU introduced a new core curriculum and consequently has designed new guides to assist transfer students with planning. ***Students planning to transfer into SCU for Fall 2010*** as a sophomore or a junior may still utilize the guide found on the following pages. ***Students planning to transfer in Fall 2011 and later*** need to refer to the guide designed for SCU's new core curriculum and should not use the document below for planning purposes.
- Oftentimes schools will cross-list a single course separately under different departments. This guide will individually list cross-listed courses for each department they are found in. It is a student's responsibility to notice whether or not a course is cross-listed as credit will only be issued one time from SCU.
- If a student takes an honors version of a course that is listed on this guide, SCU will accept that class as transferable.
- Math courses eligible for transfer to SCU to fulfill math requirements are listed on this guide. A Pre-Calculus course is eligible to receive general elective credit but will not satisfy SCU's core math requirement.

Bachelor of Arts Degree

Majors: Art, Art History, Classics (Ancient Studies, Classical Languages and Literature), Communication, English, History, Modern Languages (French, German, Italian, Spanish), Philosophy, Religious Studies, Performing Arts (Music, Theatre, Dance).

Admission requirements:

- 1) **English:** Two courses – *English 1A* and *English 1B* **OR** *English 1C*.
- 2) **Mathematics:** One course from the following: *Math 1A, 1B, 5, 6, 7*.
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science:** One lab science course from the following: *Allied Health 8, 9, 15; Biological Science 1, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 13, 15; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 12A, 12B, 30A, 30B; Geography 1; Geology 1; or Physics 1, 2A, 2B, 4A, 4B, 4C*.

Recommended courses:

The following courses allow students to complete more of SCU's Core Curriculum (General Education) requirements:

- 1) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: *Art 1A, 1B; History 7A, 7B*.
- 2) **Math or Biological/Physical Science:** One additional course in either subject area. The science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: *Anthropology 1; Astronomy 1; Ecology 1; Geology 13; Physical Science 1, 20*.
- 3) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination in order to satisfy SCU's language requirement.
- 4) **Social Science:** One course from the following: *Anthropology 2, 3, 8; Economics 1, 2, 10; Political Science 1, 3, 4; Psychology 1A, 1B; Sociology 1A, 1B, 3, 4*.
- 5) **United States:** One course from the following: *Administration of Justice 10; Anthropology 10; English 2B, 2H, 2I, 5A, 5B; Humanities 4; History 1, 2, 5, 6, 10, 12, 14; Political Science 1; Sociology 1B*.

Bachelor of Arts Degree (continued)

Recommended courses to complete more of the SCU's Core Curriculum requirements:

- 6) **Ethnic/Women's Studies:** One course from the following: *Anthropology 10; Communication 4; English 2B, 2E, 2H; History 5, 6, 10, 12; Sociology 3, 4; Theater 3.*
- 7) **World Cultures/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area List or one each from the Area and Global Lists.
Area: *Anthropology 3; Art 21.*
Global: *Anthropology 5; Geography 2; History 4A, 4B; Humanities 6; Music 6; Philosophy 6; Political Science 4.*
- 8) **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be fulfilled by a combination of courses totaling a minimum of three semester units from the following: *Art 2A, 3A, 3B, 8A, 10B, 12A, 12B, 13, 14, 15A, 15B, 16A, 16B, 34A, 34B; Digital Media 80, 140; English 9A, 9B, 9C; Mass Communications / Television(MCTV)19; Music 3A, 3B, 3C, 3D, 4A, 4B, 5A, 5B, 5C, 5D, 8A, 8B, 8C, 8D, 9A, 9B, 12, 13, 14A, 14B, 19, 26, 28; Physical Education 78; Theater Arts 4, 10, 11, 12A, 12B, 13A, 13B, 13C, 13D, 19, 21.*
- 9) **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but count only if taken at Santa Clara University.

Bachelor of Science Degree

Majors: Anthropology, Biology, Biochemistry, Chemistry, Economics, Engineering, Physics, Environmental Studies, Liberal Studies (pre-teaching), Mathematics and Computer Sciences, Physics, Political Science, Public Health Science, Psychology and Sociology.
Please note: *Students interested in majoring in Liberal Studies, Biology or Public Health Science should refer to major-specific guides on the following pages.*

Admission requirements:

- 1) **English:** Two courses – *English 1A* and *English 1B* **OR** *English 1C*.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Two courses – *Math 1A, 1B*. Anthropology, Liberal Studies, Political Science and Sociology majors can choose from *Math 1A, 1B, 5, 6, 7*. Psychology majors can complete one of the following combinations: *Math 1A* and *1B* **OR** *Math 6* and *7*.
Please note: a) *Students may not take Math 7 in conjunction with Math 1A or 1B;*
b) *Anthropology majors will need Math 5 for their major at SCU.*
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science:** One lab science course from the following: *Allied Health 8, 9, 15; Biological Science 1, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 13, 15; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 12A, 12B, 30A, 30B; Geography 1; Geology 1; or Physics 1, 2A, 2B, 4A, 4B, 4C.*

Recommended courses:

Bachelor of Science – Liberal Studies

Admission requirements:

- 1) **English:** Two courses – *English 1A* and *English 1B* **OR** *English 1C*.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Two courses from the following: *Math 1A, 1B, 5, 6, 7*.
Please note: *The Liberal Studies Department recommends that students choose Math 5 as one of their Math selections in order to better prepare them for their major coursework at SCU. Students may not take Math 7 in conjunction with Math 1A or 1B.*

Recommended courses:

The following courses allow students to complete more of SCU's Core Curriculum (General Education) / Liberal Studies requirements:

- 1) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: *Art 1A, 1B* or *History 7A, 7B*.
- 2) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination in order to satisfy SCU's language requirement.
- 3) **Social Science:** *Political Science 1* and *Psychology 1A*.
- 4) **United States History:** *History 1*.
- 5) **World Culture/Area:** *Anthropology 3*.
- 6) **Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses in Performing Arts only totaling a minimum of three semester units from the following: *Mass Communications/Television(MCTV)19; Music 3A, 3B, 3C, 3D, 4A, 4B, 5A, 5B, 5C, 5D, 8A, 8B, 8C, 8D, 9A, 9B, 12, 13, 14A, 14B, 19, 26, 28; Physical Education 78; Theater Arts 4, 11, 12A, 12B, 13A, 13B, 13C, 13D, 19, 21*.
- 7) **Biological/Physical Science with a Lab, Biological/Physical Science without Lab, Ethnic/Women's Studies, Studio/Performing Arts, Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but count only if taken at Santa Clara University.

Bachelor of Science Degree – Biology or Public Health Science

Admission requirements:

- 1) **English:** Two courses -- *English 1A* and *English 1B* **OR** *English 1C*.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Two courses – *Math 1A*, *1B*.
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science:** One lab science course from *Chemistry 1A*, *1B*.

Recommended courses:

The following courses allow students to complete more of SCU's Core Curriculum (General Education) / Biology or Public Health Science requirements:

- 1) **Statistics:** *Math 5* for Public Health Science majors only.
- 2) **Biological Sciences:** *Biological Science 1*, *4*.
- 3) **Chemistry:** *Chemistry 1B*, *12A*, *12B*.
- 4) **Physics:** *Physics 2A*, *2B* or *Physics 4A*, *4B* for Biology and those Public Health Science majors interested in pursuing a Pre-Med track only.

****Note: It is recommended that you take the introductory Biology or general Chemistry sequence courses prior to taking the Physics series.**

- 5) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: *Art 1A*, *1B*; *History 7A*, *7B*.
- 6) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination in order to satisfy SCU's language requirement.
- 7) **Social Science:** One course from the following: *Anthropology 2*, *3*, *8*; *Economics 1*, *2*, *10*; *Political Science 1*, *3*, *4*; *Psychology 1A*, *1B*; *Sociology 1A*, *1B*, *3*, *4*.
