Bachelor of Arts Degree

Majors: Art, Classics, Communication, English, History, Liberal Studies (Pre-Teaching), Modern Languages, Music, Philosophy, Religious Studies, Theatre and Dance.

The minimum required courses for admission are:

1. **English:** English 1A and 1B.
2. **Mathematics:** One course such as Math 61, 63, 71, 72 or 73.
3. **Biological or Physical Science:** One lab science course such as Anatomy 1; Astronomy 10/10L; Biology 1, 2, 3, 20, 21A, 72; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 12A, 12B, 15, 32A, 32B, 65; Environmental Science 10; Microbiology 70; Physics 2A, 2B, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

4. **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 91, 92; History 10A, 10B.
5. **Math or Science:** One additional course in either subject area. The science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: Astronomy 10; Biology 61, 63; Botany 62; Geography 10; Oceanography 10.
6. **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or a modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
7. **Social Sciences:** One course such as Anthropology 63; Economics 10A, 10B; Political Science 1, 2, 4; Psychology 10, 12; Social Science 32; Sociology 10, 11.
8. **United States:** One course such as English 80, 82A, 82B, 84A, 84B; Ethnic Studies 26, 27; History 1, 9, 17A, 17B, 21, 24; Political Science 1; Social Science 20, 30.
9. **Ethnic or Women's Studies:** One course such as English 33, 61, 80, 82A, 82B; Ethnic Studies 26, 27; History 9, 21, 24; Social Science 20, 30, 31, 32, 40.
10. **World Culture/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area List or one each from the Area and Global Lists. **Area:** Anthropology 63; Social Science 32. **Global:** Geography 11
11. **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling three semester units, such as: Art 12, 13, 14, 24, 25, 26, 28, 46A, 46B, 47A, 47B, 55A, 55B, 60, 61; Dance 10, 11, 20, 21, 40, 50, 51, 62, 63, 64, 65; Music 20, 28, 50A, 50B, 54A, 54B, 58A, 58B; Photo 22, 62; Theater 2, 3, 5.
12. **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology and a third course in English Composition** are required but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.

Bachelor of Science Degree

Majors: Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Combined Sciences, Economics, Engineering Physics, Mathematics and Computer Sciences, Physics, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology.

The minimum required courses for admission are:

1. **English:** English 1A and 1B.
2. **Mathematics:** Math 71 and 72. Anthropology, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology majors can take Math 61 and 63.
3. **Biological or Physical Science:** One lab science course such as Anatomy 1; Astronomy 10/10L; Biology 1, 2, 3, 20, 21A, 72; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 12A, 12B, 15, 32A, 32B, 65; Environmental Science 10; Microbiology 70; Physics 2A, 2B, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

4. **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences of such as Art 91, 92; History 10A, 10B.
5. **Biological or Physical Science:** One additional course. The second science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: Astronomy 10; Biology 61, 63; Botany 62; Geography 10; Oceanography 10.
6. **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or a modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
7. **Social Sciences:** One course such as Anthropology 63; Economics 10A, 10B; Political Science 1, 2, 4; Psychology 10, 12; Social Science 32; Sociology 10, 11.
8. **United States:** One course such as English 80, 82A, 82B, 84A, 84B; Ethnic Studies 26, 27; History 1, 9, 17A, 17B, 21, 24; Political Science 1; Social Science 20, 30.
9. **Ethnic or Women's Studies:** One course such as English 33, 61, 80, 82A, 82B; Ethnic Studies 26, 27; History 9, 21, 24; Social Science 20, 30, 31, 32, 40.
10. **World Culture/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area List or one each from the Area and Global Lists. **Area:** Anthropology 63; Social Science 32. **Global:** Geography 11.
11. **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling three semester units, such as: Art 12, 13, 14, 24, 25, 26, 28, 46A, 46B, 47A, 47B, 55A, 55B, 60, 61; Dance 10, 11, 20, 21, 40, 50, 51, 62, 63, 64, 65; Music 20, 28, 50A, 50B, 54A, 54B, 58A, 58B; Photo 22, 62; Theater 2, 3, 5.
12. **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology and a third course in English Composition** are required but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

3. **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences of such as Art 91, 92; History 10A, 10B.
4. **Modern Language:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or a modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
5. **Social Science:** Political Science 1 and Psychology 10.
6. **United States:** History 17A.
7. **World Cultures/Area:** Anthropology 63.
8. **Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling three semester units in performing arts, such as: Dance 10, 11, 20, 21, 40, 50, 51, 62, 63, 64, 65; Music 20, 28, 50A, 50B, 54A, 54B, 58A, 58B; Theater 2, 3, 5.
9. **Biological/Physical Science with a Lab, Ethnic/Women's Studies, Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.
