#### **Bachelor of Arts Degree**

Majors: Art, Art History, Classics (Ancient Studies, Classical Languages and Literature), Communication, English, History, Modern Languages (French, German, Italian, Spanish), Philosophy, Religious Studies, Performing Arts (Music, Theatre, Dance).

#### **The minimum required courses for admission are:**

- 1) **English:** English 100 and 110.
- 2) **Mathematics:** One course such as Math 125, 145, 200, 241, 242, 251, 252, 253, 268, 270, 275.
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science:** One natural science course with a lab such as Astronomy 100/101; Biology 110, 111, 200, 210, 220, 230, 240, 250, 260; Chemistry 100/101, 192, 210, 220, 231, 232, 250; Geology 100/101, 125, 210; Meteorology 100/101; Oceanography 100/101; Physics 210, 220, 250, 260, 270.

#### **Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:**

- 4) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 101, 102, 103; History 100, 101; Humanities 101, 102; Philosophy 160, 175.
- 5) **Math or Biological/Physical Science:** One additional course in either subject area. The science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: Astronomy 100, 115; Biology 100, 102, 125, 130, 140, 145, 160; Chemistry 100; Geography 100; Geology 100, 118; Meteorology 100; Oceanography 100; Paleontology 110; Physical Science 100.
- 6) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
- 7) **Social Science:** One course such as Anthropology 110, 180; Economics 100, 102; Philosophy 244; Political Science 100, 110, 130, 150, 200, 212; Psychology 100, 110, 200, 225, 300; Sociology 100, 105, 110, 141, 200, 300.
- 8) **United States:** One course such as English Literature 201, 202, 265; Ethnic Studies 161, 261, 262, 288, 290, 350, 425, 430, 440, 585; History 102, 201, 202, 242, 260, 270; Humanities 131, 133; Music 240; Philosophy 246; Sociology 141; Political Science 100, 200, 210, 212, 215, 220, 250, 255, 260.
- 9) **Ethnic/Women's Studies:** One course such as English Literature 265; Ethnic Studies 101, 102, 150, 151, 152, 160, 261, 262, 288, 290, 350, 425, 430, 440, 585; History 242, 260, 310; Humanities 131, 133, 136; Political Science 255, 260; Sociology 141.
- 10) **World Cultures/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area list or one each from the Area and Global lists. **Area:** Anthropology 110, 370; Art 105; Ethnic Studies 360; Philosophy 320; Political Science 120. **Global:** Geography 110, 150; History 104, 106; Political Science 130.
- 11) **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling three semester units such as Art 201, 202, 206, 207, 214, 223, 224, 231, 232, 241, 242, 301, 351, 352, 353, 354, 355, 405, 406, 411, 412; Music 131, 132, 133, 134, 301, 302, 303, 304, 320, 371, 372, 373, 374, 401, 402, 403, 404; Dance 121, 131, 132, 141, 143.
- 12) **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but count only if taken at Santa Clara University.

#### **Bachelor of Science Degree**

Majors: Anthropology, Biology, Chemistry, Combined Sciences, Economics, Engineering Physics, Environmental Sciences, Liberal Studies (please see following page for specific major guidelines), Mathematics and Computer Sciences, Physics, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology.

#### **The minimum required courses for admission are:**

- 1) **English:** English 100 and 110.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Math 251 and 252. Anthropology, Political Science, Psychology and Sociology majors can take Math 125 and 200.
- 3) **Biological or Physical Science:** One natural science course with a lab such as Astronomy 100/101; Biology 110, 111, 200, 210, 220, 230, 240, 250, 260; Chemistry 100/101, 192, 210, 220, 231, 232, 250, 410, 420; Geology 100/101, 125, 210; Meteorology 100/101; Oceanography 100/101; Physics 210, 220, 250, 260, 270.

#### **Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:**

- 4) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 101, 102, 103; History 100, 101; Humanities 101, 102; Philosophy 160, 175.
- 5) **Biological or Physical Science:** One additional course in science. This second science course can be taken with or without a lab. Non-lab science courses are: Astronomy 100, 115; Biology 100, 102, 125, 130, 140, 145, 160; Chemistry 100; Geography 100; Geology 100, 118; Meteorology 100; Oceanography 100; Paleontology 110; Physical Science 100.
- 6) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second semester course of the first-year college-level sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
- 7) **Social Science:** One course such as Anthropology 110, 180; Economics 100, 102; Philosophy 244; Political Science 100, 110, 130, 150, 200, 212; Psychology 100, 110, 200, 225, 300; Sociology 100, 105, 110, 141, 200, 300.
- 8) **United States:** One course such as English Literature 201, 202, 265; Ethnic Studies 161, 261, 262, 288, 290, 350, 425, 430, 440, 585; History 102, 201, 202, 242, 260, 270; Humanities 131, 133; Music 240; Philosophy 246; Sociology 141; Political Science 100, 200, 210, 212, 215, 220, 250, 255, 260.
- 9) **Ethnic/Women's Studies:** One course such as English Literature 265; Ethnic Studies 101, 102, 150, 151, 152, 160, 261, 262, 288, 290, 350, 425, 430, 440, 585; History 242, 260, 310; Humanities 131, 133, 136; Political Science 255, 260; Sociology 141.
- 10) **World Cultures/Societies:** **World Cultures/Societies:** Two courses may be taken from the Area list or one each from the Area and Global lists. **Area:** Anthropology 110, 370; Art 105; Ethnic Studies 360; Philosophy 320; Political Science 120. **Global:** Geography 110, 150; History 104, 106; Political Science 130.
- 11) **Studio/Performing Arts:** May be satisfied with a combination of courses totaling three semester units such as Art 201, 202, 206, 207, 214, 223, 224, 231, 232, 241, 242, 301, 351, 352, 353, 354, 355, 405, 406, 411, 412; Music 131, 132, 133, 134, 301, 302, 303, 304, 320, 371, 372, 373, 374, 401, 402, 403, 404; Dance 121, 131, 132, 141, 143.
- 12) **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required courses, but count only if taken at Santa Clara University.
