

DeAnza College Transfer Guide

School of Engineering

Majors: Civil, Computer, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering

The minimum required courses for admission are:

- 1) **English:** EWRT 1A and EWRT 1B.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Math 1A and 1B.
- 3) **Physical Science:** Chemistry 1A and Physics 4A and 4B.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

- 4) **Engineering:** Engineering 10.
- 5) **Western Culture :** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 2A, 2B, 2C; History 4A, 4B, 4C; Philosophy 20A, 20B, 20C.
- 6) **Mathematics:** Math 1C, 1D, 2A.
- 7) **Physical Science:** Physics 4C. Physics 4D is recommended for EE majors.
- 8) **Computer Sciences:** Computer Engineering majors should take CIS 27.
- 9) **Circuits:** Engineering 37.
- 10) **Statics:** Engineering 35.
- 11) **Properties of materials:** Engineering 45 is recommended for Civil and Mechanical Engineering majors only.
- 12) **Social Sciences:** One course such as Anthropology 2, 4; Economics 1, 2; International 8; Political Science 1, 2, 3, 5; Psychology 1, 2, 5, 6, 8; Sociology 1, 5, 8, 20, 28, 35; Women's Studies 28.
- 13) **United States:** One course such as Art 2F, 3TD; English (ELIT) 6, 24, 48A, 48B, 48C; F/TV 48; History 9, 17A 17B, 17C, 18A, 18B; ICS 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 18A, 18B, 20, 22, 24, 31, 32, 35, 43, 44; Political Science 1; Women's Studies 8, 9.
- 14) **World Cultures/Area:** One course such as Anthropology 2; Art 2G, 2H; History 16A, 16B, 19A, 19B, 19C; Humanities 14A, 14B, 14C; ICS 16A, 16B; International 10, 11, 12, 19A, 19B, 19C, 21, 30; Philosophy 14A, 14B, 14C; Political Science 2.
- 15) **Modern Languages:** Students are not specifically required to complete course work or pass a proficiency exam. It is advisable, however, to attain the proficiency level of at least the first college course in a second language.
- 16) **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a **Technical Writing** course are required courses, but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.
- 17) Consult the SCU Bulletin for additional freshmen and sophomore level requirements in your major. The Bulletin can be found on the SCU web site (www.scu.edu) under Academic Programs.
