Majors: Accounting, Economics, Finance, Management, Marketing, Operations & Management Information Systems.

The minimum required courses for admissions are:

- 1) **English:** English 1A and 1B.
- 2) **Mathematics:** Math 1A and 1B.
- 3) **Economics:** Economics 1A and 1B.
- 4) **Accounting:** Accounting 1A, 1B and 1C.

Recommended courses to complete more of the University's Core Curriculum:

- 5) **Business:** Business 22.
- 6) **Western Culture:** Two courses from *one* of the following sequences: Art 2A, 2B, 2C; History 4A, 4B, 4C.
- 7) **Biological or Physical Science:** One course such as Astronomy 10A/10L, 10B/10L; Biology 1A, 1B, 1C, 10, 13, 14, 15, 40A, 40B, 40C, 41; Chemistry 1A, 1B, 1C, 10, 12A, 12B, 12C, 25, 30A, 30B; Geography 1; Geology 10, 11; Meteorology 10/10L; Physics 2A, 2B, 2C, 4A, 4B, 4C, 4D, 10.
- 8) **Statistics:** Math 10.
- 9) **United States History:** One course such as Art 11, 14; Drama 8; English 12, 31, 48A, 48B, 48C; History 17A, 17B; Music 8; Political Science 1, 7, 24; Speech 6.
- 10) **Modern Languages:** Students must successfully complete the second course of the first-year sequence in a classical or modern foreign language or demonstrate an equivalent level of proficiency through examination.
- 11) **World Cultures/Societies:** One course from the Area list, such as Anthropology 2A, 6; Art 12, 13; History 15, 18, 19, 23A; Philosophy 24.
- 12) **Religious Studies, Ethics, Technology** and a third course in **English Composition** are required, but only count if taken at Santa Clara University.
- 13) Consult the SCU Bulletin for additional freshmen and sophomore level requirements in your major. The Bulletin can be found on the SCU web site (www.scu.edu) under Academic Programs.

The above information is to be used as a guide for the purpose of admissions into Santa Clara University. This information is reviewed periodically and the date of the most recent update is noted in the bottom left hand corner of this guide. Students are responsible to make sure that any courses taken are listed on this guide at the time of actual enrollment. Transferability is not guaranteed and is up to our discretion, largely based upon the Santa Clara University core curriculum in effect at the time of admission.
