## The Clothesline Project

Shirts will be On Display in Benson the Week of February 13-17<sup>th</sup>

The Clothesline Project is a visual display that bears witness to violence against men & women in all forms and CELEBRATES their personal transformation from victim to survivor.

Each shirt is decorated to represent a particular man or woman's experience of violence.

- WHITE shirts are for people who have died in violence
- YELLOW or BEIGE for people who have been battered or assaulted
- RED, PINK, or ORANGE for survivors of rape/sexual assault
- BLUE or GREEN for survivors of incest or child sexual abuse
- PURPLE or LAVENDER for people attacked because of their sexual orientation

I Pledge To:

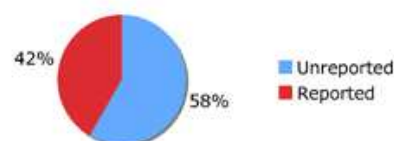
- ✓ ATTEND TAKE BACK THE NIGHT and other ON CAMPUS AWARENESS EVENTS!

**Rapes Are Still NOT Being Reported**  
**BREAK THE SILENCE**

Percentage of Sexual Assaults Reported to Police (based on a statistical average of the past 5 years)



Sexual assault is one of the most underreported crimes, with more than half still being left unreported.

*Young females are four times more likely than any other group to be the victims of sexual assault, and the least likely to report.*
