Latino immigrants are being increasingly targeted for detention and deportation as part of the domestic anti-terrorism campaigns, despite lack of any evidence of them actually participating in terrorist activity. This talk will demonstrate how the discourse on Latino immigrants has shifted from a desire to restrict their entrance and control their mobility because of fears regarding their impacts on the culture and the economy to an attempt to encumber and restrict them because they are being increasingly equated with terrorists.

Professor Anna Sampaio is an associate professor in the Department of Political Science at the University of Colorado at Denver. She graduated from Santa Clara University in 1992 (Political Science major, Ethnic Studies minor). Her recent publications include *Transnational Latina/o Communities: Politics, Processes, and Cultures*; "Theorizing Women of Color in a New Global Matrix"; and "Crossing Disciplinary Borders: Re-Examining Latino/a Studies and Latin American Studies in the 1990s."
