SANTA CLARA COURSE: Synodality, Discipleship and Mission

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COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course looks at the interrelationship of Synodality Discipleship and Mission as seen in the life of Jesus Christ as well as followers of Jesus throughout human history and as evident today. Attention will be focused on the process leading up to the recent synod in RomeAttention will be focused the role of prayer and spiritual practice in the journey of discipleship as well as the documents of the church in shaping an understanding of mission and discipleship.

LEARNING OUTCOMES AND ASSESSMENT:

Student success in this course is manifest in the ability to:

- 1. Identify key biblical texts, church documents, historical events and spiritual writings which are instrumental in developing the Christian understanding of discipleship and mission
- 2. Critically reflect, articulate, and witness to the value of spirituality and the role of context in journeying as a disciple in mission
- 3. Articulate and critically reflect on the role of spirituality, mission, and discipleship in the student's development as a minister in today's world.
- 4. Define what synodality is and the process of synodality in the life of the Christian disciple.

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENT PERFORMANCE

Assessment Methods

- Student performance in this course will be evaluated based on:
 - o Presence and participation in class and online
 - Written and oral assignments associated with readings, notes, class participation and attendance
 - o Individual and group presentations assigned during the course
 - Weekly completed assignments on the web

Criteria used for assessing performance

- **Content** (e.g., quality of material in the submission of sources learned through course notes and readings; demonstration of ability to support one's position)
- **Communication** (e.g., clarity of thought; clarity of organization of ideas; style—grammar, spelling, proper citation of sources, etc., in group situation's ability to work collegially)
- Critique (e.g., ability to identify strengths and weakness of ideas/positions presented by self and/or others; attention to what is missing in the positions/ideas of self and /or others; attention to the contexts out of which positions/ideas arise, including one's own context)

GRADING

- A Indicates the student has *significantly* exceeded the minimum expectations for the assignment. The student has consulted the relevant scholars and has consistently entered dialogue with these scholars, offering his/her critique of the relevant sources. All the required parts of the assignment are present, and the written presentation is consistently above average, with no errors in spelling or grammar. The student demonstrated leadership in the course.
- **B** Indicates the student has *exceeded the minimum* expectations for the assignment. The student has consulted relevant scholars and has entered a dialogue with most of them, offering his/her critique of the sources. All the required parts of the assignment are present, and the written presentation is above average, with no errors in spelling or grammar. The student demonstrated good participation in the course.
- C Indicates the student has *met the minimum* expectations for the assignment. The student has consulted relevant scholars and has presented their views well, at least occasionally offering a critique of the sources. The required parts of the assignment are present, and the written presentation is acceptable, with minimal errors in spelling or grammar. The student made little contribution to the group or class.
- D Indicates the student *has not met the minimum* expectations for the assignment in one or more of the following ways: significant critical scholarship is not consulted; significant segments of the assignment are missing or inadequate; or the written presentation is inadequate in grammar, spelling, or format. Minimal participation of student
 - **F** Indicates the work is not acceptable for graduate-level study.
- I Student did not complete work for the course and has consulted with the professor to complete work at later date and has completed necessary forms for an incomplete
- PI Student did not complete the work and therefore has received a permanent incomplete in the course and does not receive credit for taking the course.

CLASS ASSIGNMENTS

- 1. PRESENCE, PARTICIPATION ONLINE (35 points)
 - o **INTRODUCTION**: **(5)** Students will post an introduction to the online platform.
 - Journal Practice (15):3 Journal Entries from the book PRACTICING OUR FAITH as well as 6 spiritual practices that will be announced in class. Journals due on Saturdays.
 - **Presence and Participation in class (**15) Spiritual Practice as part of the journal experience students will be expected to participate in the spiritual practice for each module and participation in class.
- 2. PRAYER LEADERSHIP (5 points) D. Min students will be assigned and expected to develop a prayer experience for each module that is attentive to the themes of the course. Prayers developed by students will begin in February. Professor will develop prayers in January.
- 3. CRITICAL REFLECTION/SUMMARY OF READINGS (30 points total)

Students will be assigned a peer learning/discussion group for the semester. Students will have time during class to discuss the readings in their small group. Each student must post an integrative critical response to the readings on the date listed below. Each reflection is worth 10 points.

Postings are expected by the date listed below at 11:59 p.m. on date listed below.

3 postings are required during the course.

REFLECTION: Using the question below and on D2L as guides, students will post a critical reflection of the readings. (at least 4 per critical reflection)

What was your main insight? What were your questions? What were the weaknesses of the article? The strengths? What challenged you? How did the reading inform your understanding of the relationship between spirituality, discipleship, and mission? What are the implications for ministry?

4. FINAL PAPER, POWERPOINT PASTORAL PROJECT or ORAL EXAM (30 points) Due: Week of March 13

PAPER - Write an 8 – 10-page paper (double-spaced, 2,000 to 3,500 words) that discusses the themes in this course and how you would use what they have learned in your ministry. What is your understanding of mission and discipleship? How does one's journey in spirituality shape one's response? This paper is to incorporate the course readings/discussions. This paper will follow the CTU writing style manual (Turabian) for formatting and citation of sources. PROJECT

Pastoral Project. Develop a pastoral project for parish (a retreat, special event) that highlights the theme of mission and justice. Your project should include the goals of the project, the needs assessments, the participants, a description of the actual project which would include a bibliography of sources/resources used and how you plan to

evaluate the project.

Oral Interview/Exam of questions on various themes discussed in the course. Questions will be given to the student one week before the end of the semester. As a student, you will choose two questions and the professor chooses one. Meetings will be set up via videoconferencing and takes 15 – 20 minutes. Questions will be distributed for study during the last two weeks of the course.
