DOCTORAL THESIS

"Nurturing Disciplines for Revolutionary Christians"

Adviser: Dr. Walter Brueggemann

My thesis submits that intentional, sustained disciplines are required to shape and nurture faithful disciples committed to the revolutionary gospel of Jesus Christ. I present seven disciplines: praise and lament; interpretation and imagination; and retreat, resistance and engagement. I examine these disciplines through reflection on scripture, dialogue with liberation theology, and consideration of insights gained in a series of adult study classes that I taught. The conclusion of my project is that it is both necessary and urgent for the church to be about the task of nurturing disciplines for revolutionary Christians.
