A randomized controlled trial of digital mental health application and telehealthbased peer counseling to reduce depression in LGBTQ+ youth

The project evaluates two promising online approaches—a novel digital application and telehealth-based peer counseling—tailored for LGBTQ+ youth to reduce their experiences of depression. The intervention strategies will focus on a) increasing resilience to LGBTQ+ stress by helping youth externalize and reduce internalized forms of stigma and related stress; b) decreasing negative emotions through emotional regulation, and c) increasing positive emotions through rewarding activities.

Grant aims to develop and test a mobile-health based, stigma reduction and acceptance-focused, peer-delivered gender affirmation intervention for Chinese transfeminine women and engage them in HIV prevention via promoting mental and sexual health. This research will evaluate gender affirmative care as an HIV prevention strategy for transgender women in the region.

The first is to qualitatively understand QMOC's intersectional stress and challenges with self-compassion. The second is to design a tailored online intervention to increase their psychological well-being and self-compassion, modeled after the empirically validated 8-week intervention by Neff and Germer (2013).
