Proposal Guidelines

When submitting your proposal, please include the following information:

1. Curriculum Vitae (CV)

2. Lecture/Workshop Details:

- Title of the lecture/workshop
- Proposed length of the session
- Desired time of year for offering

3. Course Description:

Provide a brief narrative of your course content. The description should focus on one of the following areas:

- Psychological assessment and intervention methods with credible empirical support,
- Ethical, legal, statutory, or regulatory policies, guidelines, and standards impacting psychological practice, education, or research,
- Psychological practice, education, or research grounded in contemporary scholarship and established research methodologies.

4. Learning Objectives:

List the key learning objectives participants will achieve by the end of the lecture/workshop.

5. Peer-Reviewed Sources:

Include at least three peer-reviewed, scholarly articles published within the last ten years, relevant to your workshop content.

6. Target Audience:

Specify whether the content is intended for introductory, intermediate, or advanced learners.

7. Multicultural Considerations:

Provide a statement on how your workshop addresses multiculturalism and the needs of underrepresented populations.

8. Course Content Evaluation:

Describe the value, accuracy, and utility of your course content, as well as the limitations and any potential severe or common risks.
