Arlie R. Hochschild Lecture—Strangers in Their Own Land: Challenges Climbing the “Empathy Wall”

Renowned professor of sociology, Arlie R. Hochschild, will describe her journey from her own liberal cultural enclave to a conservative one. She will discuss her choice of research site in Louisiana’s oil and petrochemical belt where she interviewed Tea Party enthusiasts, her effort to remove her own political alarm system and will focus on her concept of the “deep story” - a version of which underlies all political belief and offers the possibility for finding common ground.

Dillenberger Lecture in Art History

“Abbess as *Alter Christus: Delineating Female Sanctity in Spain and Spanish America.*” *Cristina Cruz González, Associate Professor of Art History, Oklahoma State University.* Using examples from Spain, Mexico, and Guatemala, this talk explores various pictorial strategies for capturing and performing an *alter Christus* status in a transatlantic Spanish world. Often neglected by scholars who tend to examine the mystical Bride of Christ imagery, González discusses the female *imitatio Christi* and the ecclesiastical pretense exhibited by several early modern holy women in Spain and Spanish America.
