## Religion and Culture Lecture Series: Legal Landscapes and Contracting Worlds in James Welch's Fools Crow

Published in 1986, Welch's historical novel is set in Montana in the late nineteenth century, and deals significantly
with U.S. military and settler encroachment on Pikuni (Blackfeet) lands and communities. This lecture tracks
representations of visual practices, particularly dreaming, in opening up alternative spaces where Pikuni individuals can
traverse and negotiate various contractual agreements with spiritual and/or non-human powers.
