

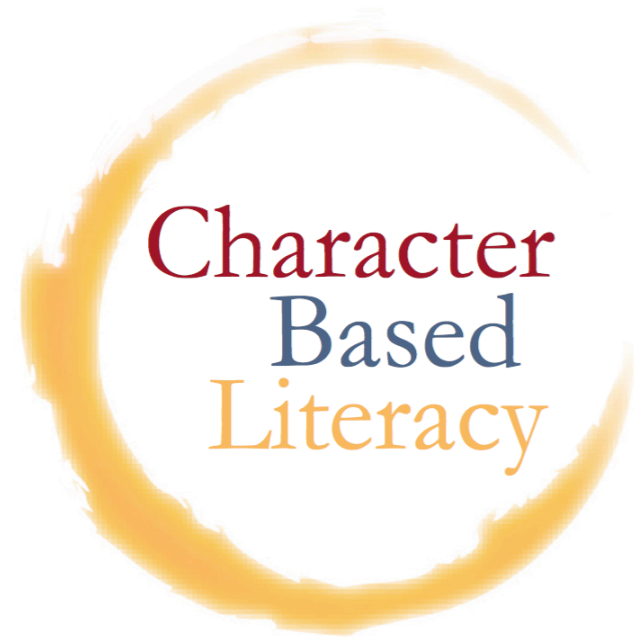

<p><b><u>1. Background</u></b> Build a context for the ideas, places, persons, or events in today's reading.</p> <p><b><u>2. Wordwall</u></b> Add five words to the wordwall after explicit instruction and practice.</p>	<p><b><u>3. Review</u></b> Review the most important timeline events from the beginning .</p> <p><b><u>4. Read</u></b> Read the selection for today.</p>	<p><b><u>5. Timeline</u></b> Agree on the most important events in today's reading, and list 3-5 on the timeline.</p> <p><b><u>6. Map</u></b> Add to an ongoing map, chart, or other graphic organizer.</p>	<p><b><u>7. Activity</u></b> Explore the reading with a visual or oral language activity.</p> <p><b><u>8. Discussion</u></b> Prompt in depth discussion with questions from the 9 territories.</p> <p><b><u>9. Analysis</u></b> Analyze the key paragraph closely.</p>	<p><b><u>10. Write</u></b> Every student writes a short product from today's prompt to connect to the unit theme.</p> <p><b><u>11. Close</u></b> Close by extending today's lesson to life and the world</p>
