WORD WALL: AMBITION

Ambition, confidence, dreams, dedication, perseverance, empowerment, inspiration.

SYNOPSIS

A young girl admires Misty Copeland and dreams of becoming a dancer like her. She compares herself to the adult dancer and becomes discouraged because she believes she will never attain that level of skill. Misty Copeland tells the girl that before her success, she too was just a young girl with a dream. Misty explains that it took time, hard work, and dedication to achieve her goals and that with enough practice, the girl can reach her dream of becoming a dancer.

DISCUSSION

Say: This story is about a young girl who dreams of being a dancer but feels that she is not good enough. Ask: Can you explain why the young dancer felt self-doubt? Allow children to respond, and affirm: The girl was comparing herself to someone with years of training and skill development under her belt. When we set goals for ourselves, it is important to start small and recognize each little bit of progress that we make. In the end, the small steps add up, and we see a significant result! Ask: How did Misty Copeland help her overcome those doubts? On the board, record children's answers to the following questions to assess and solidify their comprehension of the story's main ideas. Ask: Why is it important to have role models? Why is

it important to not let self-doubt stop you from going after your goals? **Conclude** the discussion by listing the character values that we need to accomplish goals, including perseverance, courage, adaptability, initiative, self-reliance, optimism, and resourcefulness.

GROUP ACTIVITY

Say: Today will create something beautiful that will reflect the goals we want to achieve. Color and vibrancy are crucial elements to this story. Misty Copeland believes that empowerment can come in all shapes, colors, and sizes. Use art to demonstrate what empowers you to reach your goals. Distribute the "Learning to Fly" worksheet (included in this lesson plan) and provide students with art materials to decorate the wings creatively. Say: How you choose to decorate the wings should represent your personality and your future aspirations. Connect to the lesson's theme: Integrity requires that we accomplish our goals while being true to ourselves and making responsible decisions.


AT-HOME ACTIVITY
