

Q2 2021 HEERF Student Aid Report

CRRSAA (HEERF II) and ARP (HEERF III)

Santa Clara University (SCU), in compliance with:

1. Section 314(e) of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), which directs institutions receiving funds from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to submit reports to the Secretary of Education describing the use of the funds distributed from the HEERF;
2. The Department of Education's (ED) reporting authority under 2 CFR 200.328 and 2 CFR 200.329 for reporting on the institution's use of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) HEERF funds; and
3. reporting updates sent from the Department of Education's (ED) Program Officer;

is posting by July 10, 2021 the Q2 report related to SCU's CRRSAA (a)(1) and ARP (a)(1) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students in a format and location easily accessible to the public.

1. SCU has signed and returned to ED the Certification and Agreement and assurance that SCU is using or has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA (a)(1) and ARP (a)(1) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
2. SCU has received \$1,771,339.00 from the CRRSAA (a)(1) program, and has been allocated to receive \$4,603,451 from the ARP (a)(1) program.
3. a. As of May 18, 2021, SCU distributed all (\$1,771,339.00) of the CRRSAA (a)(1) program HEERF funds in the form of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. SCU provides students with notice of award status in advance and expedites the distribution of funds immediately thereafter.
- 3 b. As of the last date of this reporting period, SCU has not distributed funds from the ARP (a)(1) program, and is in the process of developing a plan to do so.
4. a. The estimated total number of SCU students eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) is approximately 7,300.

4. b. SCU is determining the number of students eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the ARP (a)(1) program.

5. a. The total number of students who received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program is 1,333.

5. b. As of the date of this report, no students have received Emergency Financial Aid Grants under the ARP (a)(1) program.

6. a. The method(s) used by SCU to determine which students could receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they could receive under the CRRSAA (a)(1) program are as follows:

In accordance with ED's direction, SCU prioritized the distribution of funds to eligible students demonstrating exceptional need. The funds were prioritized for students who qualify for federal Pell Grants or state Cal Grants. Eligible students who were known to have exceptional need based on information available to the Office of Financial Aid were notified on March 12, 2021 that they would receive grants of \$1,500 each without needing to apply. Students who were not Pell Grant or Cal Grant recipients could apply for funding if they had a self-identified hardship need due to the coronavirus. Beginning March 29, 2021, this second group of students were able to submit an online request form application attesting to their exceptional need for emergency funds. After the application submission deadline (April 16, 2021), requests were reviewed, and SCU divided the remaining amount of CRRSAA funds equally among eligible students who submitted a valid application. Students from this second group of grant recipients received grants of \$1,005.07 each.

6. b. The method(s) which will be used by SCU to determine which students can receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they could receive under ARP (a)(1) program are currently being developed.

7. a. Instructions and FAQs concerning the CRRSAA Emergency Financial Aid Grants were provided to students on the SCU website. All students received email notifications about the program.
