Dear members of the wonderful Catala family,

July 1 often marks a period of transition in most university communities. Santa Clara is no different, and this July 1 we warmly welcome our new president, **Dr. Julie Sullivan**. Dr. Sullivan comes to us from the University of St. Thomas in Minnesota, where she served as the first layperson and female president of the school. Prior to St. Thomas, she was the Executive Vice President and Provost at the University of San Diego. A native of Florida, she holds Bachelor's degree in accounting, a Master's degree in taxation and a Ph.D in Business from the University of Florida. Once she is here and settled, we hope to host Dr. Sullivan as a speaker at one of our lunches.

July 1 also marks the appointment of our own **Fr. Michael "Mic" McCarthy '88** as the new Dean of the School of Theology and Ministry at Boston College. Congratulations, Fr. Mic!

The July 1 "season" started me thinking about previous SCU presidents and of our founding chaplain in particular. As by now you all know, Catala was started by **Fr. James Lyons S.J.** in 1930. He became SCU's 19th president in 1932 — a true Depression Era president. During this time, enrollment plummeted and popular programs like the baseball team had to be cancelled. As he navigated these choppy waters, his stewardship of Santa Clara was recognized by the Catholic hierarchy and, in due course, he was asked by the California Provincial to post Santa Clara as collateral for a \$50,000 loan being sought to shore up other Jesuit universities. He declined, citing that his priority was Santa Clara and not other schools. The matter ended up in Rome, whose officials agreed with Fr. Lyons.

Fr. Lyons was removed from office in 1935, one year before the expiration of his term. The reason for his removal was never publicly disclosed, though many speculated at the time that his defiance of the Provincial in order to protect Santa Clara was the cause. From Santa Clara, he moved to Loyola

University in Los Angeles (today Loyola Marymount) as the Dean of Students.

The spirit of Fr. Lyons was alive and well with us at the June 18 Anniversary Gala to celebrate our 92nd birthday. The evening was nothing short of magical, and I extend my heartfelt thanks to our wonderful cochairs **Leana Giannini**, **Katy Kelly**, and **Charlene Raisch** — along with their amazing Board committees — for creating such a memorable evening for us. This was girl power at its absolute best. In the immortal words of the great Tony Bennett, "Here's to the Ladies"!

Congratulations to the group that won the "grand" prize in the auction: a dinner hosted by Dr. Sullivan. Thank you for your generosity in making this the standout auction item of the night.

The magic was topped off by a very special guest. All the way from Los Angeles, Fr. Michael Engh (SCU President 2009-2019 and a *big* Catala fan) traveled to join us for the evening. Fr. Engh's presence reminds us how special our Jesuits are to us, both as a University and to Catala in particular. Along these lines, we were honored to have a number of Jesuit friends with us for the party: Br. Tom Bracco, Fr. Art Liebscher, Fr. Paul Mariani, Fr. John Mossi, Fr. Peter Pabst, Fr. Rob Scholla and, of course, Catala's beloved Chaplain, Fr. Jack Treacy. In addition, we enjoyed the good wishes of Fr. William Rewak (SCU President 1976-1988 and Chancellor 2011-2016) who, while unable to attend, sent his love and blessings to the celebration. (Enjoy the photos pages 5-10)

"Although no building bears the name of the Catala Club, the Club identified with the Adobe Lodge. The Board meets in the Directors Salon of the Lodge, which is beautifully furnished by the Club with its 22 hand-carved chairs (one bearing the seal of the Club and the other 21 chairs having a carved representation of each of the 21 missions).

The kitchenette in the salon was fully equipped by the Catala Club. The larger room of the Lodge, used for meetings and classes, was decorated by the Club for campus use and for the Club's monthly meetings.

The Club was also responsible for the furnishings and decorations for the Sodality Room and the Conference Room on the first floor of the newly built Nobili Hall, as well as the furnishings and decorations for the parlors of the Faculty Building."

Nevertheless, I feel very fortunate to continue pursuing my education and have enjoyed every course I have taken here at Santa Clara. As a first generation student, I feel incredibly fortunate to have the opportunity to pursue an education and pursue a career in engineering.

Since returning to campus this year I have been working hard to get involved in the campus community and developing relationships with my professors as well as my peers. This has been a great experience as I was unable to interact very closely with the Santa Clara community while learning remotely during freshman and sophomore year. Now, having spent this time on campus, I have found other hard working mechanical engineers who are great resources and strive for greatness. This course serves as a first step in a training process where Santa Clara students study satellite operations systems and how they are operated. This would be a tremendous opportunity to learn how to operate these complex systems and how satellite missions are carried out.

Overall, I hope to find a great engineering internship opportunity over the summer where I can gain a better understanding of the engineering industry.

In conclusion, attending Santa Clara University has been a fantastic experience so far and I feel exceptionally grateful for the opportunity to pursue this dream. As a first generation student, this scholarship is extremely important to that dream and I am eternally grateful.

Thank you again to all who were involved in our 92nd Anniversary Party!


